

Media Release - Summer Food Service Program

Stressing the importance of offering nutritious meals to children during the summer months, Woodruff J1 School District announces the sponsorship of the Summer Food Service Program.

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), which is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, provides nutritious meals to children during the summer, when free and reduced-price school meals are typically unavailable. Free meals will be made available to children 18 years of age and under. Persons over 18 years of age who are determined by a state or local public educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled and who also participate in a public or private non-profit school program during the regular school year may receive free meals as well.

Arbor Vitae – Woodruff Elementary School will be serving the **free** meals this summer **Monday-Friday, starting Monday, June 10 and ending Friday, June 21**. Breakfast will be served from 7:10 a.m. – 8:10 and lunch from 10:45 a.m. – 11:45. **All students who are 18-years old and younger eat for free.** Adult meals are \$2.00 for breakfast and \$4.00 for lunch. Meals are provided to eligible children regardless of race, color, national origin, age, gender or disability and there will be no discrimination in the course of meal service.

“This program fills a void created when school lunches are not available,” said Maggie Bishop, Food Service Director. “Helping parents meet the nutritional needs of their children is the strength of this program.”
